## Non-Profit Awarded Grant

**Monument, CO, May 22, 2009:** The Tri-Lakes Health Advocacy Partnership (HAP), an established non-profit organization, has been awarded a grant of \$5,000 from the Mountain View Electric's Round-Up Fund. The Round-Up Grant will fund a major portion of HAP's established Senior Meals program that provides weekly nutritious meals for seniors in the Tri-Lakes area.

HAP's Senior Alliance, supported by community volunteer servers from the Tri-Lakes United Methodist Church, deeply discounted meals from Pinecrest Catering in Palmer Lake, and with the cooperation of School District 38, hosts the Wednesday lunches at Lewis Palmer's Big Red administration building.
