Seniors Programs Receives Funds

Monument, CO, November 16, 2009. The Tri-Lakes Health Advocacy Partnership (HAP), an established non-profit organization located in north El Paso County, received a \$1000 contribution for its many seniors programs from the Town of Monument. The money was received by the Town of Monument from the Pikes Peak Regional Building Department for the purpose of supporting seniors programs in the local community. Monument chose to donate the money directly to Tri-Lakes HAP.

HAP Board Chairman, Mark Ennis expressed the gratitude of the entire Board upon receipt of the contribution, saying that every dollar will go directly to the area seniors for senior programs such as the senior lunches, Senior Citizens Center programs, and the popular senior day tours.

This is the second cash contribution received by HAP from the town of Monument in two months. On September 28, 2009 the Monument trustees contributed \$2000 to HAP for support of its many community programs.
